

**** FROM THE PASTOR ****

On this, the last Sunday of the calendar year, we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Family. Today's feast reminds us that Jesus chose to live and grow, as part of an ordinary human family, rather than miraculously appear out of the blue, as an extraordinary, but unknown, adult.

There is more significance to that choice than we might think.

A few years ago, a study was undertaken to find the U.S. city with the lowest incidence of cancer and heart disease. The winner was the tiny, insignificant town of Roseto, Pennsylvania.

Experts quickly descended upon the little city to find out the secret to their health. Not surprisingly, they were expecting to see a town populated by non-smokers, people who ate the correct food, took regular exercise, and kept close track of their cholesterol.

To their great surprise, however, the researchers discovered that none of the above was true. They found instead that the city's good health appeared to be directly connected to the close family bonds that prevailed within the close-knit Italian American community.

They concluded that there clearly is much to be said for a close and loving family relationship. They began referring to this life extending phenomenon as the "Roseto Effect."

Jesus knew this. When He said that He came that we might have Life and have it more abundantly, He was not talking in a merely spiritual or futuristic sense. He meant it quite literally. By His own example, He demonstrated that a full and abundant life, both begins and flourishes within the context of a loving family.

Today's celebration of the Holy Family reminds us that, although Christ's life began within His close-knit biological family, it was not limited to them. It would soon expand to include His Apostles, and Disciples, and all who do the Will of God the Father.

We are all potentially brothers and sisters to Christ, living within the loving context of the Holy Family. A full and abundant life can be ours if we are willing to expend the effort necessary to be part of the family.
